Eligible projects must be completed between January 1st 2017 and 31st December 2022.</p> <p>Please provide the RCN project number when applying to this call.</p> <p>The Norwegian applicant listed as PI must have an approved doctorate or similar qualifications before the date of the application submission deadline.</p> <p>If you do not have an approved doctorate but are qualified at associate professorship level or have current or previous employment in a position as forsker 1 (research professor), forsker 2 (senior researcher) or seniorforsker (senior researcher) in the institute sector or a health trust, you are also qualified to be listed as PI or co-PI.</p> |
| | Project location requirements | Applicants need to state in which country contexts the project will be implemented. This can be in Norway as well as all participating countries represented in the application or in selected country contexts only. |

| | Ethics policy/statement | <p>Ethical guidelines</p> <p>Projects funded by the RCN are to maintain high ethical standards and uphold fundamental principles for integrity and ethics in research.</p> <p>Approval from the Norwegian Regional Committees for Medical and Health Research Ethics (REK) is required for all types of medical and health research projects that include trials on humans or involve human biological material. Approval from REK is also required for the establishment of research biobanks. More detailed information is available on the REK website.</p> <p>Data management plans</p> <p>The Research Council has stipulated requirements relating to self-archiving and open access to scientific articles produced in connection with the R&D projects it funds. For all projects that are awarded funding, we will ask the Project Owner to draw up a data management plan.</p> <p>The Project Owner must assess the need for a data management plan for all projects awarded funding. If the Project Owner believes there will be no need for such a data management plan, this must be explained.
