POST-DOCTORAL POSITION

The Physical activity, Sport and Recreation (PhASRec) Research Focus Area in the Faculty of Health Sciences of the Potchefstroom campus at the North-West University, South Africa, is welcoming applications for a post-doctoral position.

PhASRec consists of experienced researchers focusing their research on physical activity in health, sport, and recreation in order to optimise health and performance over the life span.

As a post-doctoral student, you will be:

- Assisting in all aspects of the research project (data collection, data analysis, manuscript preparation and critical reading).
- Writing of grant applications.

Skills and qualifications required:

- A recently qualified PhD in Human Movement Sciences or a related field (Less than 5 years PhD qualified).
- Experience in **biomechanics** and the related testing protocols (e.g., motion analysis, force plates, pressure plates, EMG, isokinetic dynamometry etc).
- Experience in statistical software packages (e.g., SPSS, JASP) and **basic coding/scripting** (e.g., Matlab, Python etc).
- Scientific report writing in the related fields of studies.
- Team player, highly motivated, enthusiastic personality and able to work with people of different socioeconomic backgrounds and cultures.

The position is available for a period of 1 year but can be extended to three years. The salary is based on current post-doctoral bursary scales of the North-West University and the remuneration is sufficient to cover accommodation and a daily subsistence. A financial contribution will be made for travel arrangements to Potchefstroom by the University as part of the fellowship.
